Comparative and Superlative Adjectives

Adjectives are words that describe, identify, or quantify nouns and pronouns.

They help specify our writing by offering more details about nouns and pronouns.

Comparative Adjectives

Comparative adjectives are used to compare two things—they help describe differences between two nouns.

My television is bigger than my computer.

- My television + is + bigger + than + my computer.
- Noun (subject) + verb + comparative adjective + than + noun (object) Example Sentence



Superlative Adjectives

Superlative adjectives are used to compare three or more things. They help describe things on either end of a spectrum (e.g., smallest and largest, tallest and shortest).

Example Sentence : My English professor is the smartest person.

- My English professor + is + the + smartest + person.
- Superlative adjectives are generally used in the following sentence structure:
- Noun (subject) + verb + the + superlative adjective + noun (object)

fast	faster	fastest
cheap	cheaper	cheapest
big	bigger	biggest



Adjective	Comparative	Superlative
gentle	gentler	gentlest
happy	happier	happiest
polite	more polite	most polite

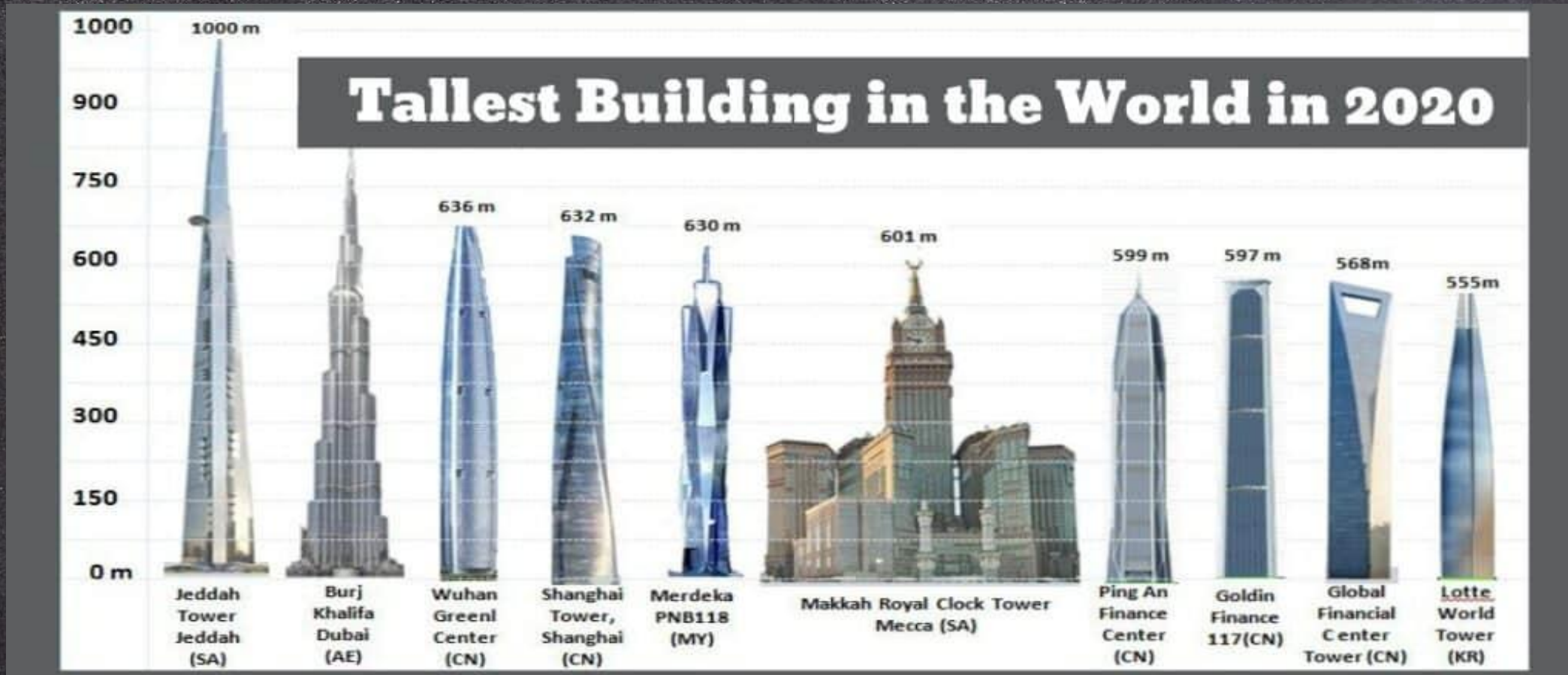
