It revealed the full breadth of human potential for bravery, self-sacrifice, cowardice and willful negligence.







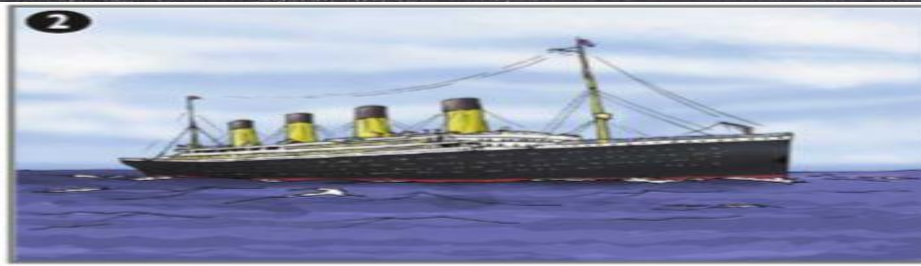

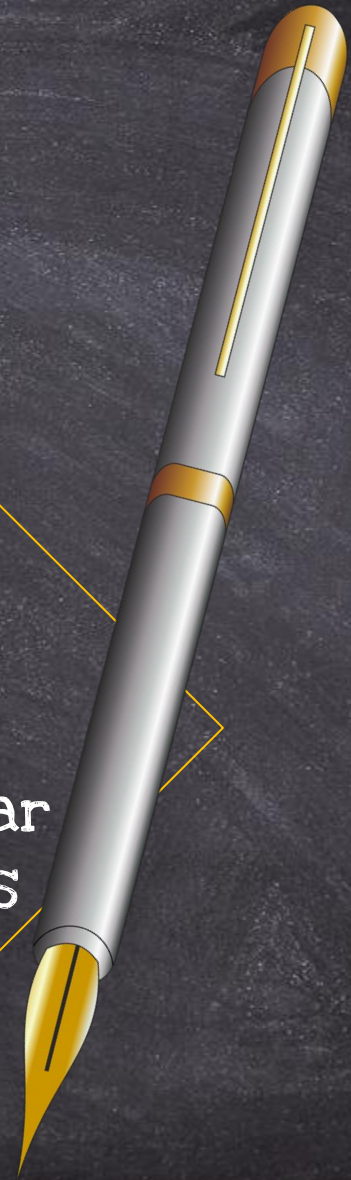






## Narrating a Story
