


## Describe the sea animals



## Examples:

- The dolphin is grey and does not have arms or legs.
- The whale needs to come up to the surface to take a breath.
- shark and ray are dangerous animals.
- Turtle, lobster and oyster have shells
- Octopus, jellyfish and squid are got tentacles instead of legs.

# What is the main difference between human and sea animals?

• Humans have got lungs which require oxygen, but some sea animals do too, because they are either mammals or reptile with lungs. These sea animals need to come up to the surface to take a breath. Even though they live in the water, they can not get oxygen from the water.



#### Past continuous

past continuous tense is sometimes called the past Progressive usually we need
it when we talk about a continuous action in the past so something that was
happening during a specific period of time and it was continuous.

- Ex: This morning between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. I was playing football.
- so it was a continuous action and I was doing it for a specific period of time in the past continuously.

### Form:

I / He / She / It → Was Sara was sleeping at 8 am .

They / we / you → Were Osama and Ahmed were playing video games at 9 pm.
