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PRESENT PERFECT

- We use present perfect tense to talk about an action has just been completed or when we don't know exactly when the action happened.
- E.g. I have just cleaned the living room
 - We have already watched the film.
 - Ammar has arrived Mecca.



PRESENT PERFECT

Form:

• Subject + Have/has + V-p.p

I /they/ you/ we \rightarrow have She/he / it \rightarrow has

Have \rightarrow 've has \rightarrow 's

- Shahd 's Tided up her room. (tidy up)
- Hasan has arrived England. (arrive)

Has Hasan arrived England?

- Negative sentence form:
 Subject + have/ has + not + v-p.p.
- Ali hasn't worked today.
- Question form:

Have/ has + subject + v-p.p.? Has Ali worked today?
