

Boy 2: Oh, yes. I think it looks smart!



At last, he arrived at the shop.




He tried on some comfortable jeans, a striped sweatshirt, a spotted hat and some trainers.

beautiful!'


'It's called silk,' said Arthur. 'It's used to make jackets that are worn by princes.'



TRADITIONAL CLOTHES

Different countries have different traditional clothes.

These Omani men are wearing the traditional dishdasha.

This is cool and comfortable to wear in the heat. Men also wear a small, embroidered hat called a kuma. On special occasions, like weddings and Eid, a curved dagger called a khanjar and a turban are also worn.




A kilt is a traditional checked skirt that is worn by men, women and children on special days in Scotland. It's made of wool. This boy is also wearing a white top and long white socks. He looks very smart. He's playing the bagpipes, a traditional Scottish musical instrument.

The pattern of a kilt is called a tartan.
