



Woman: This week, we're talking to Scott Samson about how to keep safe outdoors. Hello, Scott.


Scott:

So the first thing you need to do if you are lost outdoors is breathe slowly. It will help you think more clearly. Next, you must find clean water to drink, so find a river. Then you should follow the river because rivers often go somewhere where you can get help, like a town. You will feel really hungry, but you don't need to eat anything right now. First you must make a shelter so that you have somewhere safe to lie down. After that, you should make a fire to keep you warm. Also, someone could see the fire and come and find you. Use dry grass and wood for your fire. Finally, you need to find something to eat, but be careful! Some plants aren't safe to eat.
