Genetically Modified Food (GM)

Genetically Modified GM foods are produced from plants which have had their DNA modified in the lab. A lot of people are worried about the consequences of changing the plants' genes, as this might affect their health. But those who promote GM foods are convinced it will eventually solve the world's hunger problems by improving the quality of crops.

In fact, around 65% of the food we get from the shops has some genetically modified component. Anyone who consumes cheese, potatoes, tomatoes, soybeans, corn, wheat, and salmon is taking in GM food. In 1994, in the USA, the first GM food that was marketed, was tomato. A few years later, around 26 other countries, including Canada, Argentina, Brazil and some Asian countries like India and Indonesia started growing GM foods. By 2022 the GM foods growth increased globally, and in total 65 of the world's 195 countries now have GM crops.

Genetically modified crops are easier for farmers to grow, which makes them cheaper for the consumers. For example, according to the International Service for Agriculture in the USA, the insect-resistant corn has increased by 9% in fields where it is planted. In 1997, 2.8 million hectares of this variety of corn were planted in the U.S. and farmers were able to avoid using \$190 million worth of bug spray. Another example is in South Africa, where the first GM cotton crop proved extremely successful, raising crop output by 50 - 90%. Growing GM cotton requires less work time and effort. The GM cotton seed income now shows increases of 129%.

Although current research suggests that GM foods are safe, there is some concern around their long-term safety and environmental impact. For example, GM foods contain foreign genes, so some people worry that this might lead to allergic reactions and cancers because cancers are caused by DNA changes. Some people fear that eating foods with added genes may affect their DNA. A study from the mid-1990s found that adding a protein from Brazil nuts to soybeans could cause an allergic reaction in people. However, after scientists discovered this, they banned this GM food. Another concern is that farmers worried that the reduction in pesticide use might result in long term environmental problems such as creating superweeds and insects which would disrupt global food systems.

In 1998, a researcher at the Rowett Institute for Agriculture announced that genetically modified potatoes affected rats in the control group. The potatoes produced an ingredient made them resistant to diseases. But, this limited the growth rate of the rats and they were less resistant to disease.

Europeans tend to avoid using the GM foods, and some nature care organizations are trying to stop the use of GM crops in European countries. After all, a lot of research is still required to prove the long-term health effects of GM foods. So, it is time to rethink the whole issue and return to plant more natural food.

The Chilean mine rescue

On the 5th of August 2010, part of a San Jose gold and copper mine collapsed while miners were digging deep inside a mountain. The mine was located in the Atacama Desert in Northern Chile. Thirty-three miners, ranging in age from 19 to 63 were trapped 700 meters below the ground. At the beginning, they tried to escape through the mine's air openings, but they could not because they were blocked by immense rocks. They panicked, but one of the miners called Luis Urzua persuaded them that they should stay together as one group, use the strength of each other to keep their spirits up and survive.

There were enough emergency supplies of food and water for two to three days. They had to make this supply last longer as they did not know how long they would be underground for. So, they agreed as a team to take meals only once every two days.

While the miners were busy finding ways to survive under the ground, rescuers were carefully digging down into the rocks to see if they could find any sign of life. For sixteen days, the trapped miners heard the drill getting closer. On the 22^{nd} of August, one of the 30 investigative drills broke through into the space where the miners were. The miners attached a note to the drill, "We are fine in the shelter, the 33 of us" to let the rescuers know that they were alive. Later, video cameras were sent down the drill hole and pictures of the miners were seen by the families who were camping on-site in the tents during the rescue effort. They also sent communication devices, food, water, first aid supplies and lighting devices to the trapped miners in a blue plastic capsule. Thirty-five days later, the rescue teams made a tunnel that was wide enough to bring the miners out.

Meanwhile, a team of engineers from NASA designed a special steel capsule called the "Phoenix." It was painted in blue, red and white, the colours of the Chilean flag. It was very big, about 420 kg in weight and 1.9 metres long. It was made just wider than a man's shoulders, about 53 cm wide, to go smoothly through the narrow tunnel. Therefore, miners were restricted to a diet of 2000 calories a day to ensure that they could fit into the capsule to be brought up to the surface through the tunnel.

Reading 3 (continued)

On the 12th of October, the rescue began. The steel capsule brought up the men one by one. The operation worked well and was completed in twenty-three hours. All the thirty-three miners were lifted safely to the surface after being trapped for sixty-nine days under the ground. The rescue was reported much more widely than previous mining rescue attempts. It was shown live on TV news broadcasts around the world that more than 1 billion people watched.

The 33 miners are remembered in many books and films. However, the best portrait I have ever read was called, 'Deep Down Dark.' It was written in 2014 by the journalist Héctor Toba, who received exclusive access to the miners and their tales. He described how the miners felt and what they had experienced underground. One year later, the novel was turned into a film called, "The 33."
